

UTeach and AVID Teacher Preparation


- Cochran-Smith and Powers (2010) identified 10 trends in teacher preparation: one is the "proliferation of multiple routes into teaching".
- UTeach is a national program that addresses the shortage of math and science teachers; was founded at University of Texas at Austin (1997); and science and mathematics majors earn content degrees and secondary teaching certification.
- UTeach RGV is a middle and high school mathematics and science teacher preparation and certification program that promotes inquirybased learning and instruction through early and consistent community-based teaching experiences.
- AVID Teacher Preparation provides teacher candidates with a deep understanding of, and practical experience with, AVID frameworks, methodologies, and strategies that they practice prior to teaching.

44 UTeach Sites in 23 States

Nationwide: more than 7,000 students & 4,000 graduates

UTeach RGV: 324 active science/math majors & 218 total graduates (Sept. 2019) UTeach RGV began in 2012; UTRGV AVID Teacher Prep began in 2013



Early Field Experience Model prior to Clinical Teaching

Science and Math Majors

AVID Teacher Preparation

- Provides teacher candidates with best teaching practices and practical teaching experiences
- Based on AVID's research-based writing, inquiry, collaboration, organization, and reading (WICOR) strategies
- Faculty members receive WICOR professional development to model for teacher candidates and coaching calls
- Courses are enhanced with WICOR strategies
- Teacher candidates implement the strategies during field experiences and clinical teaching



Collected video and audio recordings of interviews


Transcribed the interviews

Focus Groups



Theme: Preparedness

So, I feel I'm really prepared for almost, I would say, every type of learner. Like different strategies and all of that. And now that I'm at the end I realized that all of the work we did, because it was a lot of work, but none of it was in vain, that's what prepared me. I'm applying everything I learned from Step 1, everything from Step 2... I really soaked it all in. While I was taking the classes I didn't realize it, but now everything is coming together.

Challenges

Preparedness: Diverse and vulnerable populations

I feel like that's one of the things that I didn't really feel prepared for...dealing with 504 students and all the special ed stuff...It's hard because you have to be exposed to it. Because there are so many different variables. Not one kid is going to be exactly the same. There is an infinite amount of disabilities.

Theme: Self-Reflection

Ongoing instructor and peer feedback

What helps us is that our professors observe us and then provide feedback... 'this is what I really liked that you did and this is what you need to modify'. Then we come to seminar class and talk about all these modifications... other students share how their day was, how their lessons went. So we learn by their experiences...not only ours. We learn by stories they tell us, too. And then we modify it again.

Theme: AVID Strategies in the Field

I think if anything the AVID strategies are more helpful to the student who doesn't already take really good notes or who doesn't actually sit and think about the problem for themselves. They need to be pushed to compare and contrast things. They are the ones that really get help by the strategies. The kids that already do that are like 'I see it, I have to write it down' and they do that automatically. The kids that don't, it forces them to do it and then sometimes that's the thing that will make it click for them.

This year our school became an AVID school, so they were pushing the AVID strategies a lot. I do the "the bell ringers" at the beginning of class and that worked really well for most of my classes. 'We are probably going to take notes today because there's a bell ringer'. It helps them be organized. We do the interactive journal. It's a way for them to organize their content and have everything ready. If I say go back to the notes, some students will look back at the notes and read it and they're like "oh, okay I get it". It's a way to organize their thoughts.

All the mentors and instructors are truly invested in your well-being and in your development as a teacher...we've graduated a while ago and they still e-mail us for professional development. They're still there if we need help. And they truly care for how we're doing as teachers and how our students are going to do because we're their teachers.
